Principles

At St Peter's we share the care, safety, and wellbeing of all children. At St Peter's, we want to create a welcoming school where we are all respected, our ideas are shared and our voices are heard and where we are safe and cared for.

We the children of St Peter's ask that all adults:

Listen to us

Respect us

Treat us with kindness and love

Treat us fairly

Include everyone equally

Support and assist us when we ask for and/or need your help

Make decisions that keep us safe and protected.

To keep children safe at St Peter's, Clayton

- Adults and children should be respectful to each other at all times using good manners
- Adults should listen to students without judgement
- Decisions are made and implemented to keep everyone safe
- Every adult who comes to the school needs to care for all and behave respectfully
- Anything that is told to an adult by a child will be treated seriously and with sensitivity
- Everyone works together to keep everyone safe and happy

Acceptable Behaviours

All adults at St Peter's School must:

- treat everyone with respect and dignity at all times
- listen and act if children report behaviour that is unsafe or inappropriate
- follow all child safe policies and procedures
- ensure that everyone can participate
- promote the safety of all children

Unacceptable Behaviours

All adults at St Peter's School must not:

- treat any child unfairly or differently
- use inappropriate language or discuss inappropriate topics
- express their own views on culture, religion, race or sexuality
- put children in danger
- ignore a child when they are asking for help
- ignore any incidents, suspected or reported, when a child has been treated in an unsafe or inappropriate way
